POSITION OVERVIEW

The Assistant Men's and Women's Cross Country coach is a part-time position under the supervision of the Director of Athletics. The employee serves as the assistant coach of the men's and women's cross country teams and assists the head coach in running this athletic program in accordance with Maine Maritime Academy, North Atlantic Conference, and NCAA rules, regulations and policies. The employee must be committed to promoting academic and athletic achievement in a way that is fully aligned with the mission of Maine Maritime Academy Athletics and the NCAA Division III philosophy.

COACHING DUTIES

- Serve as the Assistant Coach of the men's and women's cross country programs, responsible for teaching and training student athletes
- Conduct high-quality teaching in a humane learning environment
- Ensure safety of all team members and coaches is the top priority at all times
- Recruit and retain roster of student-athletes

This job description reflects the general duties of the job but is not a detailed description of all duties which may be inherent to the position. The Academy may assign reasonably related additional duties to individual employees consistent with policy and collective bargaining agreements.
