Adjunct Faculty Position – Online – Graduate Program: BA507 Economics for Management Decision Making

POSITION OVERVIEW

Adjunct faculty are non-permanent, temporary faculty who are hired on a semester-by-semester basis. This opening is expected to teach a 9-week, 3-credit hours course in the **Fall 2024** – **Session 1 Term.** The course will run from mid-August to mid-October. This is a graduate level online course taught in an asynchronous environment. The successful candidate will develop and deliver course material utilizing a variety of interactive tools including video. This candidate will also manage the graduate online course through discussions, group projects, and other assessment means.

Due to State Hiring Requirements, you must be a resident of the State of Maine.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Economics for Management Decision-Making offers a practical exploration of managerial economics, equipping participants with essential tools and diverse perspectives crucial for effective decision-making. This course covers the allocation of scarce resources, the theory of the firm, forecasting demand, market structure, and pricing decisions. It delves into additional topics, including tariffs, quotas, exchange rate determination, and current issues. Gain valuable insights and analytical skills to navigate the complexities of decision-making in the business environment.

- Teach at graduate level in areas allocated by the Dean of the Loeb-Sullivan School.
- Contribute to the development, planning and implementation of a high quality curriculum.
- Assist in the development of learning materials, by preparing syllabus and lesson plans and maintaining records to monitor student progress, achievement and attendance.
- Participate in the development, administration and marking of exams, papers, presentations, and other assessments.
- Provide advice and support to students.
- Inform students of their progress by promptly returning assignments, quizzes, papers and exams
