Adjunct Faculty Position – Online – Graduate Program: BA503 – Organizational Development

POSITION OVERVIEW

Adjunct faculty are non-permanent, temporary faculty who are hired on a semester-by-semester basis. This opening is expected to teach a 9-week, 3-credit hours course in the **Spring 2025** – **Session 3 Term.** Session runs from mid-January to mid-March. This is a graduate level online course taught in an asynchronous environment. The successful candidate will develop and deliver course material utilizing a variety of interactive tools including video. This candidate will also manage the graduate online course through discussions, group projects, and other assessment means.

Due to State Hiring Requirements, you must be a resident of the State of Maine.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course enhances supply chain managers' organizational assessment, intervention, and design skills, particularly in the context of mergers, acquisitions, and consolidations prevalent in today's business landscape. Students explore the connection between organizational design and effectiveness, the complexities of strategy formulation, the impact of cross-cultural and national factors on organizational behavior and culture, the consequences of change on organizational and workforce development, and the evolving role of leadership in the 21st century. The curriculum integrates group projects and case studies on logistics, maritime management, and operations.

DUTIES

- Teach at graduate level in areas allocated by the Dean of the Loeb-Sullivan School.
- Contribute to the development, planning and implementation of a high-quality curriculum.
- Assist in the development of learning materials, by preparing syllabus and lesson plans and maintaining records to monitor student progress, achievement and attendance.
- Participate in the development, administration and marking of exams, papers, presentations, and other assessments.
- Provide advice and support to students.
- Inform students of their progress by promptly returning assignments, quizzes, papers and exams
