# **ACRONYMS & LINGO**

Companies, industries, and higher education alike love acronyms and oftentimes have their own lingo. Below are some of the common acronyms & lingo you'll hear on campus:

<u>The Bilge</u> ~ Located within Curtis Hall, this recreational space has a pool & ping-pong table, TVs, board games, couches, a video game lounge, and a kitchen.

<u>CAB</u> (Campus Activities Board)  $\sim$  A student group, which plans and sponsors a variety of on and offcampus events for students to take advantage of.

<u>Mess Deck</u>  $\sim$  Located in the Alfond Student Center, this is the main dining room/location on campus.

<u>MUGs</u> (Midshipmen Under Guidance) ~ New members of the Regiment of Midshipmen are known as MUGs during RPT and MUG Month.

<u>Non-Reg</u> ~ Students who are not a part of the Regiment of Midshipmen. You may also hear these students referred to as Independent Students.

<u>OLs</u> (Orientation Leaders) ~ OLs are returning students who assist incoming students in their transition to MMA during New Student Orientations during the summer and during Fall Orientation after your arrival to campus and before the first day of classes. <u>On Neck</u> ~ Refers to the area of Castine between the British Canal & Dyce Head.

 $\underline{RAs}$  (Resident Assistants) ~ RAs are students who are charged with being leaders, resources, and community builders to the residents of Curtis Hall.

<u>Reg</u> ~ Refers to The Regiment of Midshipmen, or Regimental Students (those students in The Regiment of Midshipmen).

<u>RPT</u> (Regimental Preparatory Training)  $\sim$  The time during which MUGs are prepared for regimental life.

<u>SGA</u> (Student Government Association) ~ Student leaders elected by their peers to represent the MMA student body as a whole.

<u>The Wedge</u> ~ Student leaders within the Reg who are responsible for the Regiment and its organization.

<u>Waypoint</u> ~ A snack bar offering grab-and-go foods, a limited menu to order from, and Starbucks drinks to get you going in the mornings. Also a place where students gather and hang out or study.

Roommate Selection (Optional):

Independent Students: If you find someone you want to room with this year, you can make a roommate group in the oncampus housing application. Roommate groups need to be created by July 15. If you don't have someone in mind, no worries, the answers to the personality questions you provide on your housing app will help us pair you up with a roommate.

Regimental Students: The Regiment does not allow you to choose your roommate during your first year.

<u>New Student Orientation (NSO)</u>: NSO sessions will be held on: Saturday, June 1; Saturday, June 15; and Saturday, July 13. While not required, MMA encourages students, and families, to attend one of the sessions if able. Registration for an NSO is required, and sign-up is embedded in your housing application.
