Parking

The parking lots closest to NSO are currently being dug up and repaved, so parking on Saturday will be in the Commons Parking Lot (#10 on the campus map), with handicapped parking available across from the back of the bleachers of Ritchie Field (#19 on the campus map). Learn about Castine's rich maritime and colonial history.
