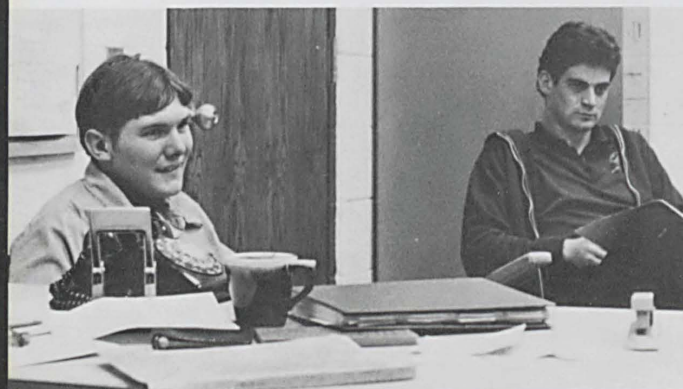
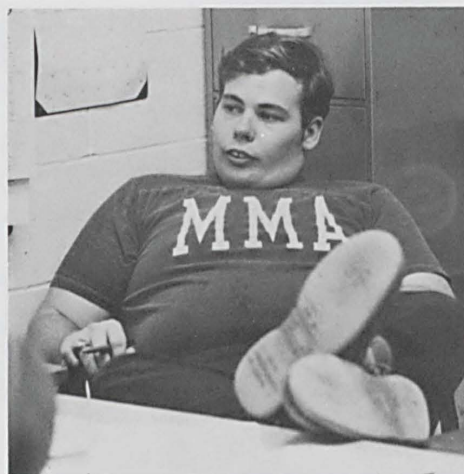
HARVEY E. FRENCH

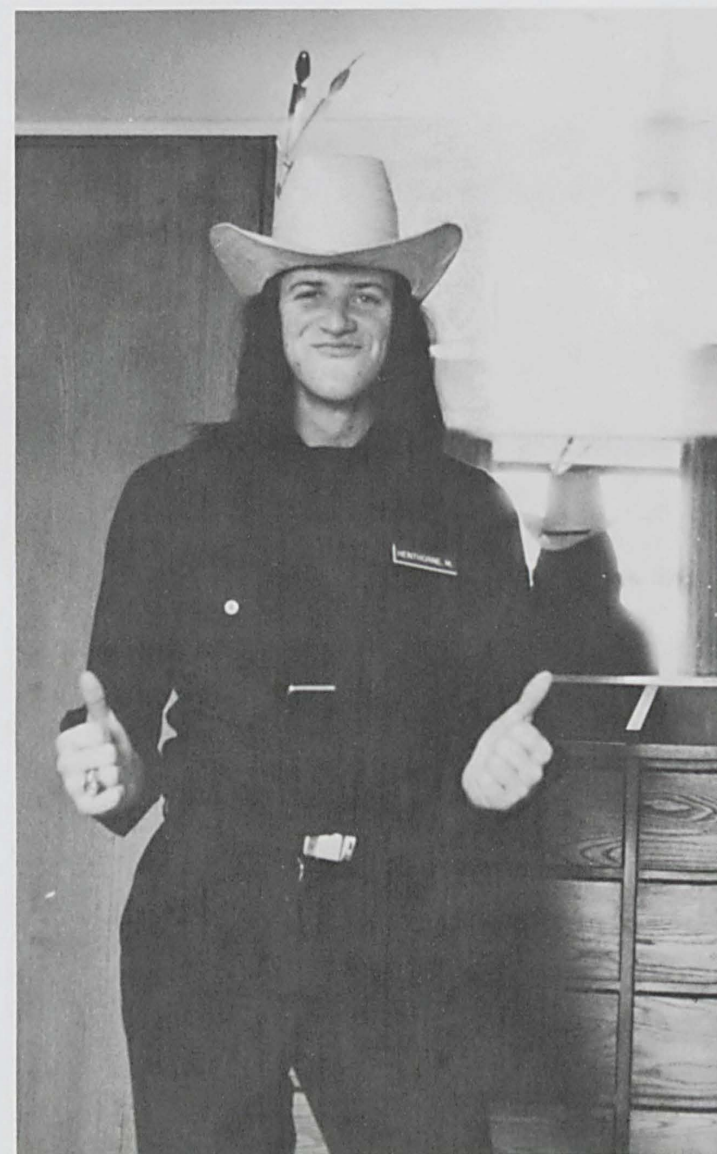
From Baltimore it was back to Castine and the excitement of a cruise that was supposed to have been was lost.
