For the first time in eight consecutive years, MMA beat Bridgewater St. It was during this game that defensive back Don Boucher set a school record with a 90 yard interception return for a touchdown. This occurred with just seconds left on the clock which clinched the emotion-filled game for MMA.

Every game played on the Mariners' home field was not only won, but decided in the last few minutes of play. This provided extreme excitement for fans and players alike.

One of these teams was a very heavily favored Mass. Maritime football team whose chance for the 1979 conference championship was crushed by our "angry Mariners" before a Homecoming crowd.

Individual awards this year went to senior Paul Perry who was named as one of the N.E.F.C. all-conference selections at right offensive tackle, while junior — Tom Clow was named as one of the N.A.I.A. District 3 all-regional selections at inside linebacker.

On Friday, February 22, 1980 a decision concerning the future of broomball at this academy was made.

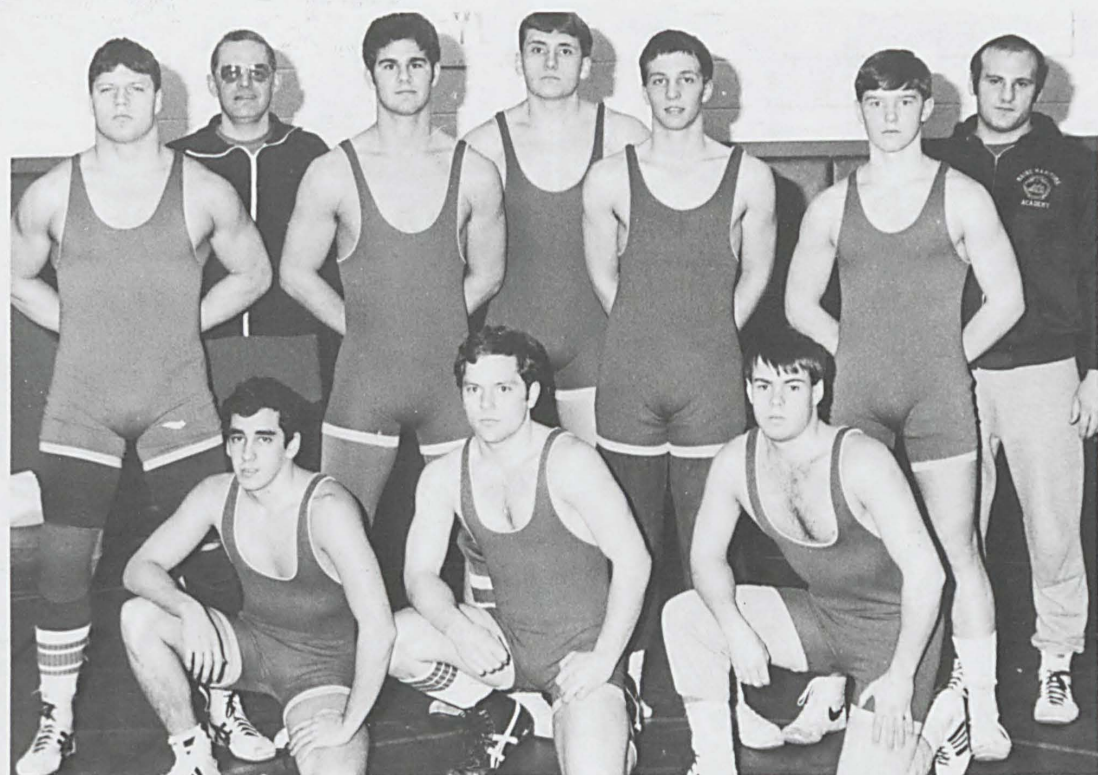

G.S. — Knowledge of the english language is a wonderful thing but the ability to talk to people is a necessary one. Something you've yet to master.

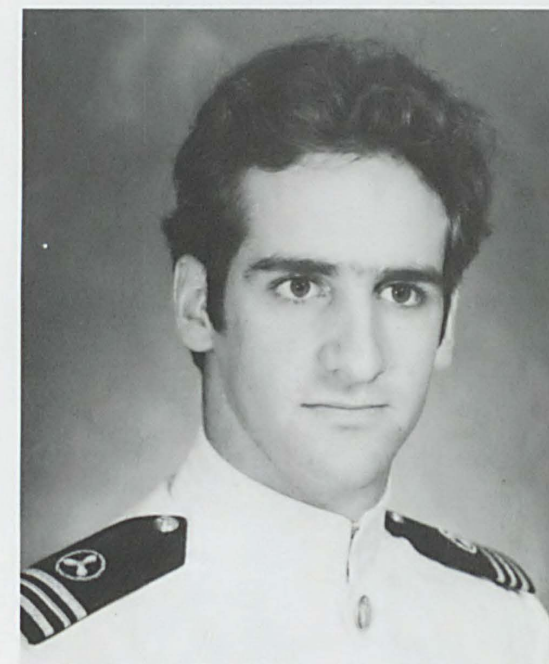
