
Cross Country

This year's football team finished with an overall record of seven wins and two losses. This was an excellent start for our new head coach, Bruce Morse. We ended up second in the N.E.F.C. championship race.

There were many records broken and set for future teams to strive for. Offense led the way, coming in 2nd in rushing in the N.C.A.A. and 5th in the N.A.I.A. They set three school records as a squad this year. 299.0 yards per game, scoring 32 touchdowns, 27 of which were by rushing. The total yards per season was also staggering. This was also a school record as well as a new league record, 2691 yards in one season.

The offense was not the only impressive attribute to this year's team. The defense had a great season also. They lost the most players from last year's championship team. The underclassmen filled in the spaces most efficiently. The defense ended up 9th in the N.C.A.A. and the N.A.I.A. in rushing defense, allowing only 73.8 yards per game and only five touchdowns rushing, which is another school record.

Individual awards: Tom Boothroyd was awarded All-N.A.I.A. District 19 team, E.C.A.C. Div. III All Star, U.P.I.'s Div. II-III New England College Team. Dana Merrill, Alan Harrison, Larry White, Skip Jordan, and Jim Brown all made the NEFC All Star Team. Joe Clark, Larry Shedler, and Mike Morrissey made the NEFC honorable mention list. Alan Harrison also received honors from ECAC Div. III All Star Team and the UPI's Div. II-III New England College Team.

Larry White set a new school rushing record and was the league's top rusher with 1,072 total yards for the season and 119.1 yards per game.

We will be losing 9 players this year, Seniors Mike Morrissey, Doug Lamson, Paul Ostberg, Brian Boardman, Skip Jordan, Alan Harrison, John McKeown, Tom Boothroyd and Jr. Larry White. We also say goodbye to our senior defensive back coach Gary Keene.

the end - thank God, Mother and the Heffalump


