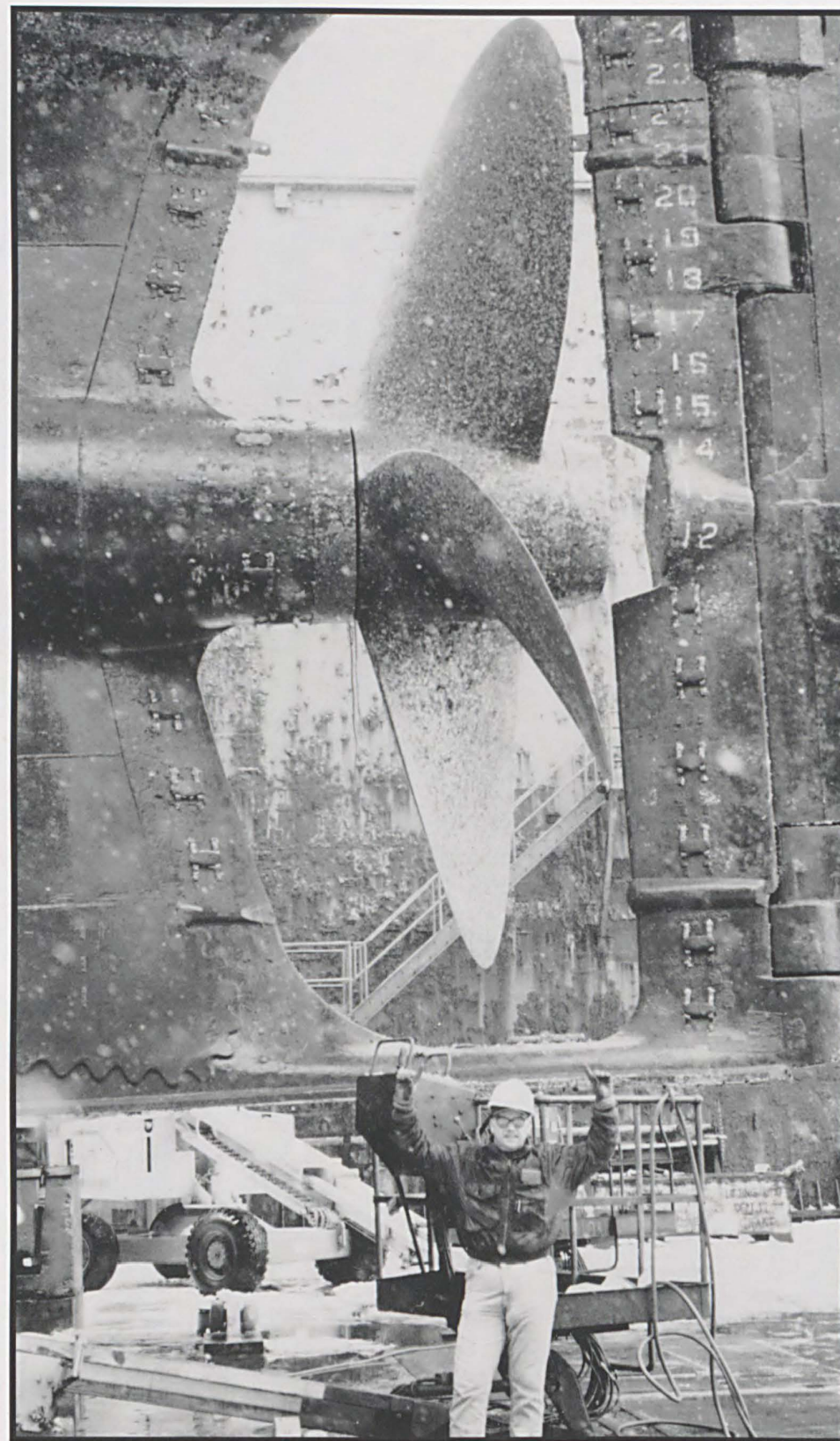
The fall big boat sailing team also took third place in Corinthians inter-collegiate Big Boat Regatta.

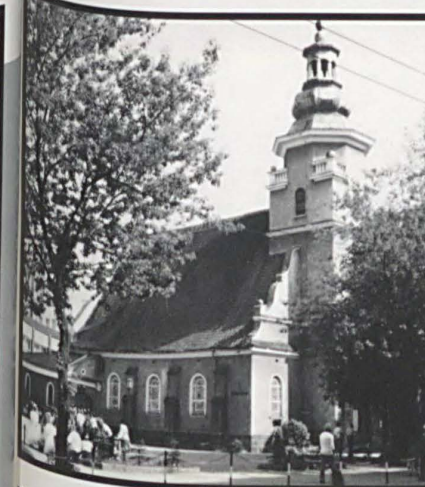
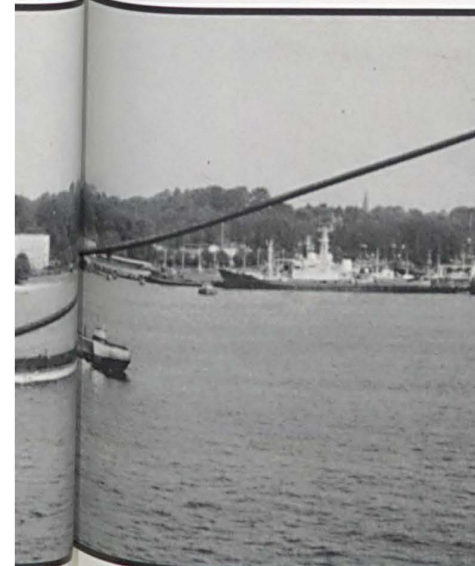
RUSSIA

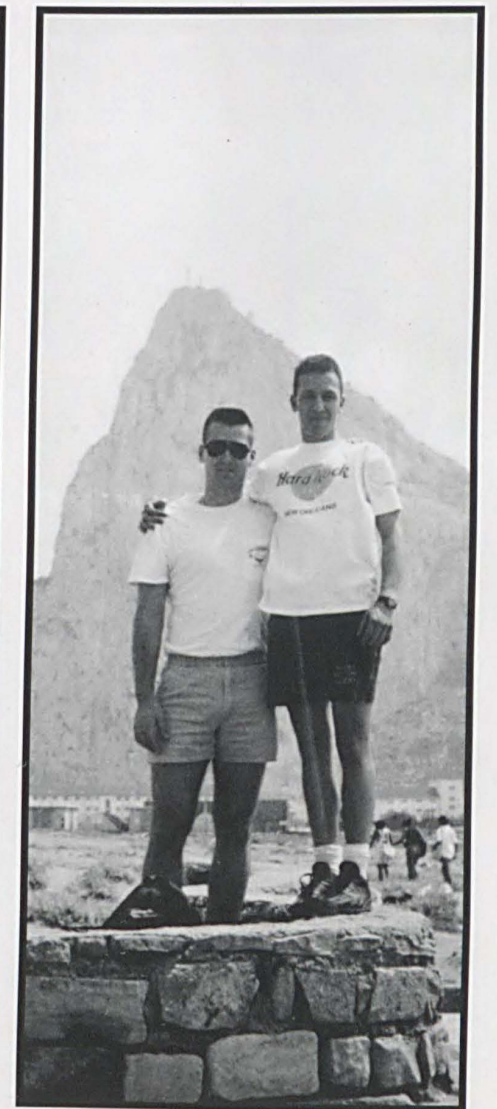
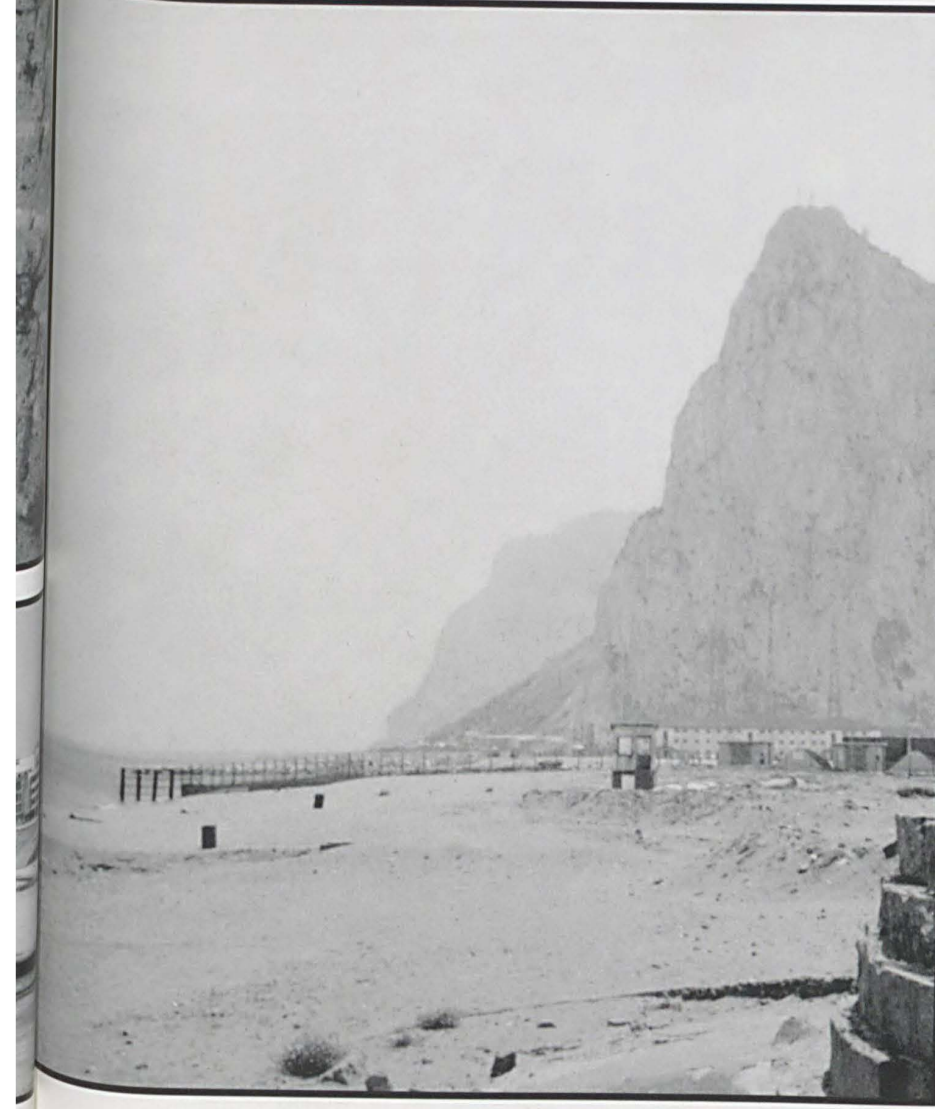
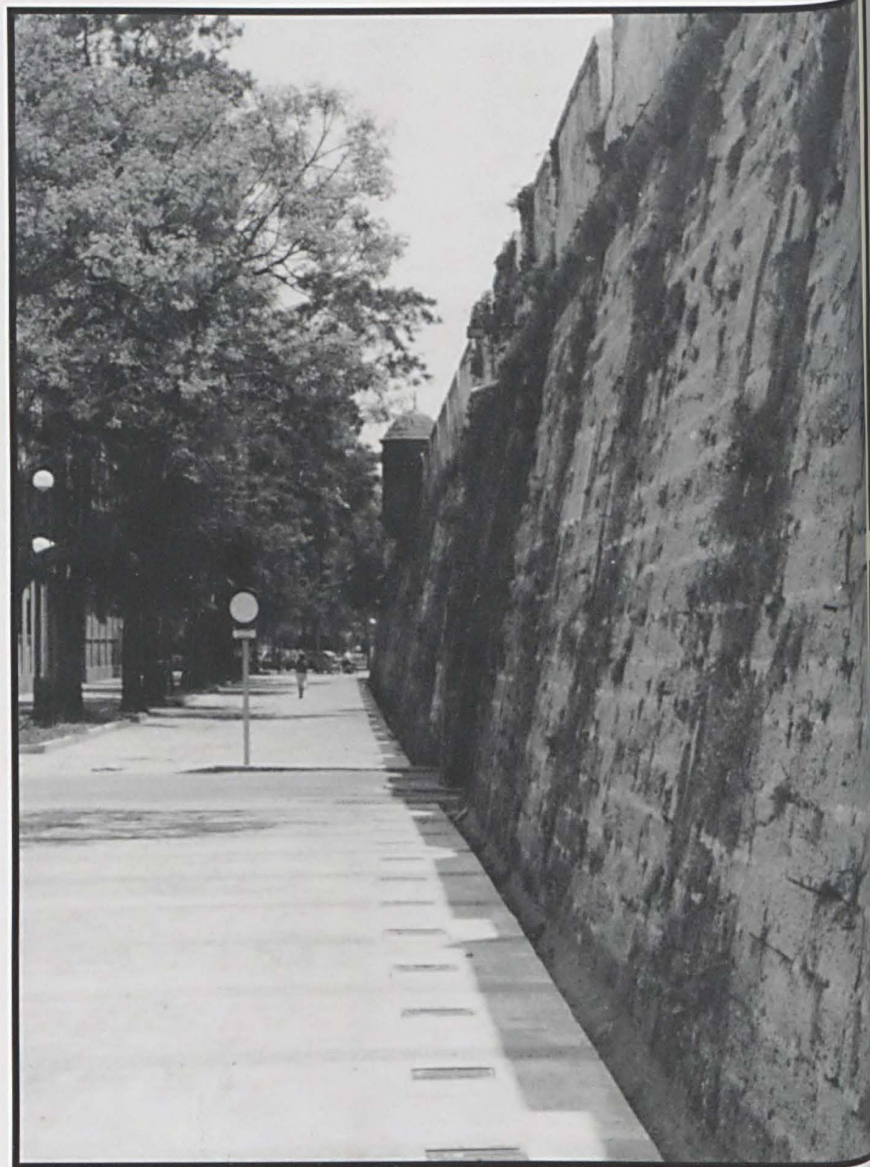
POLAND

CADIZ, SPAIN

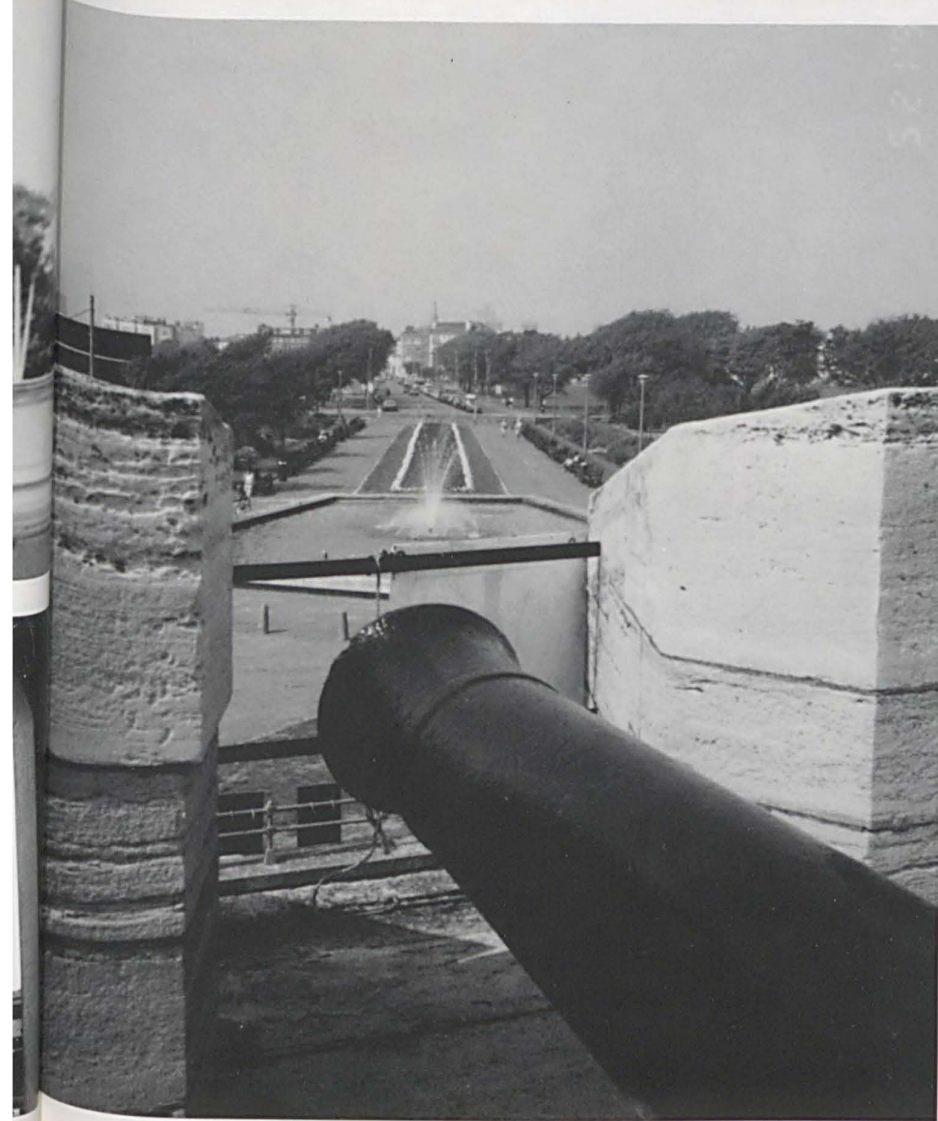
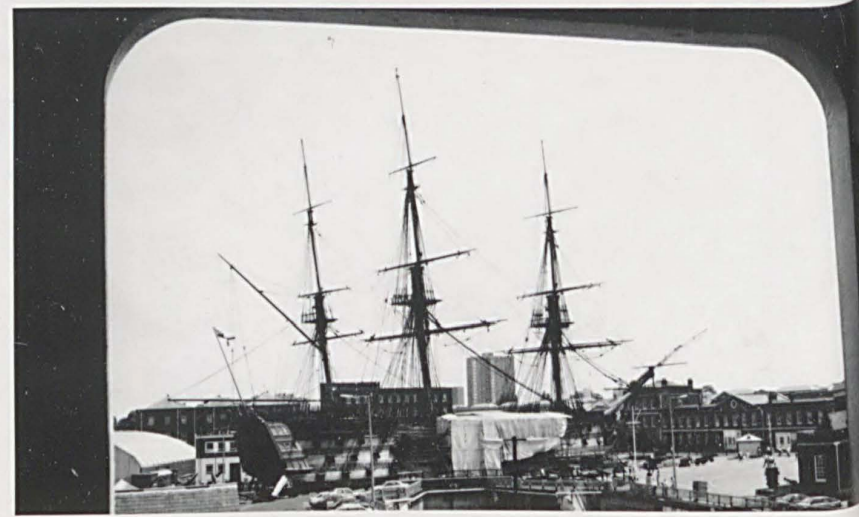

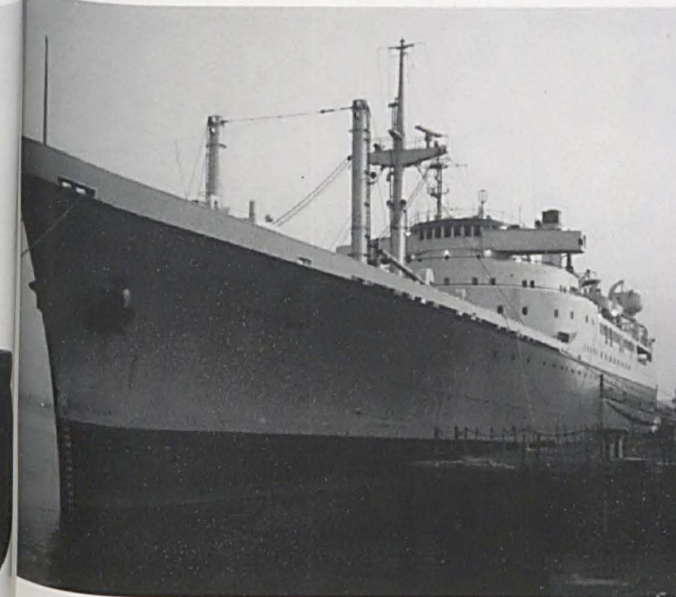
PORTSMOUTH, ENGLAND

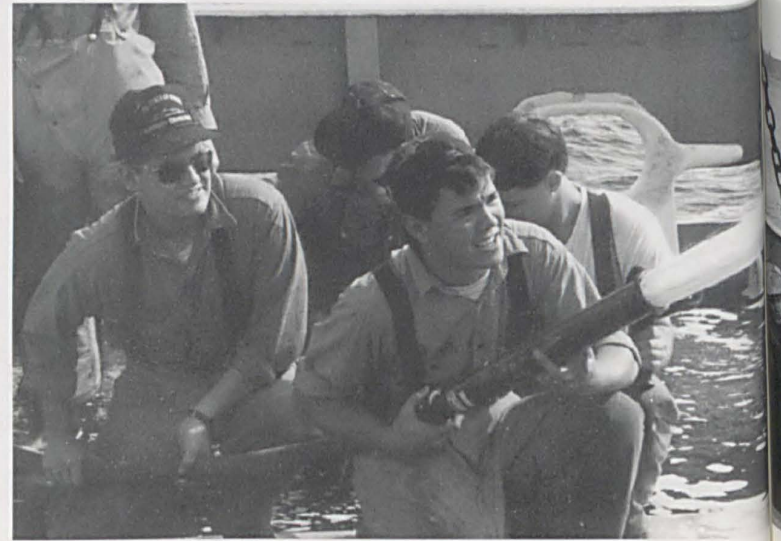




MMA FIRE BRIGADE
