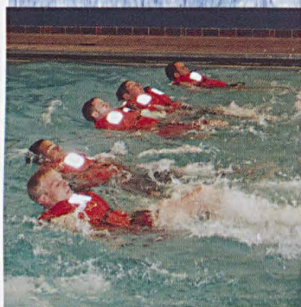

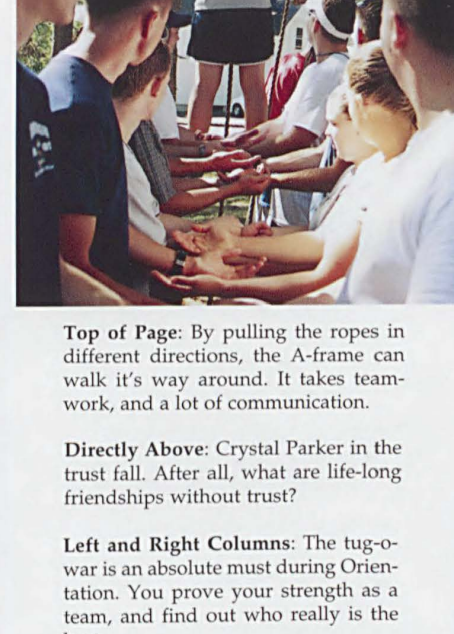
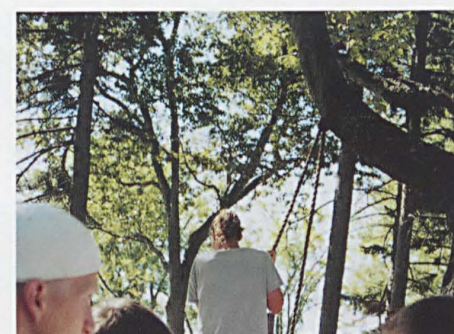

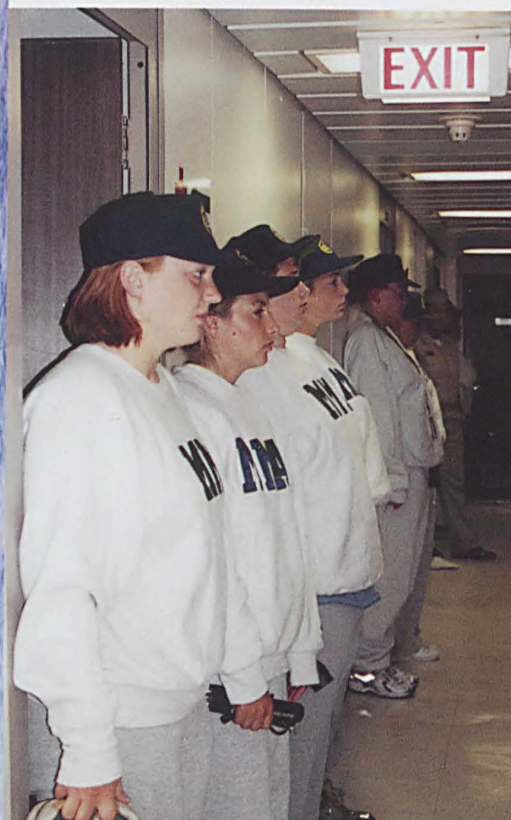

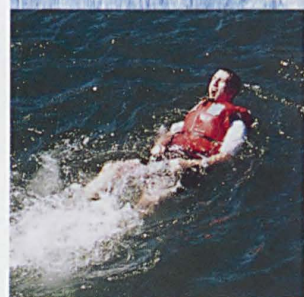

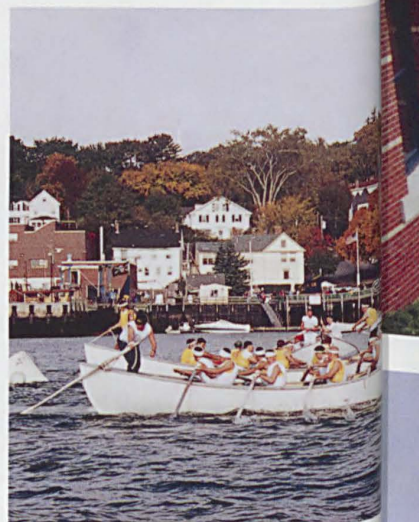

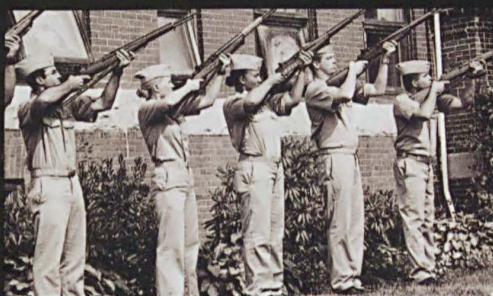


September 11 One Year Later

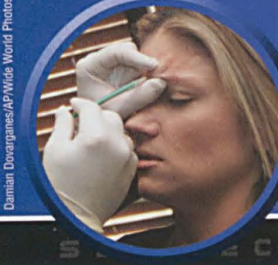

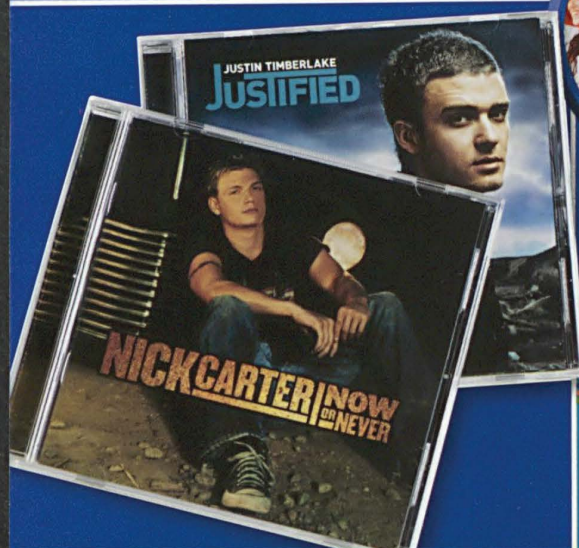

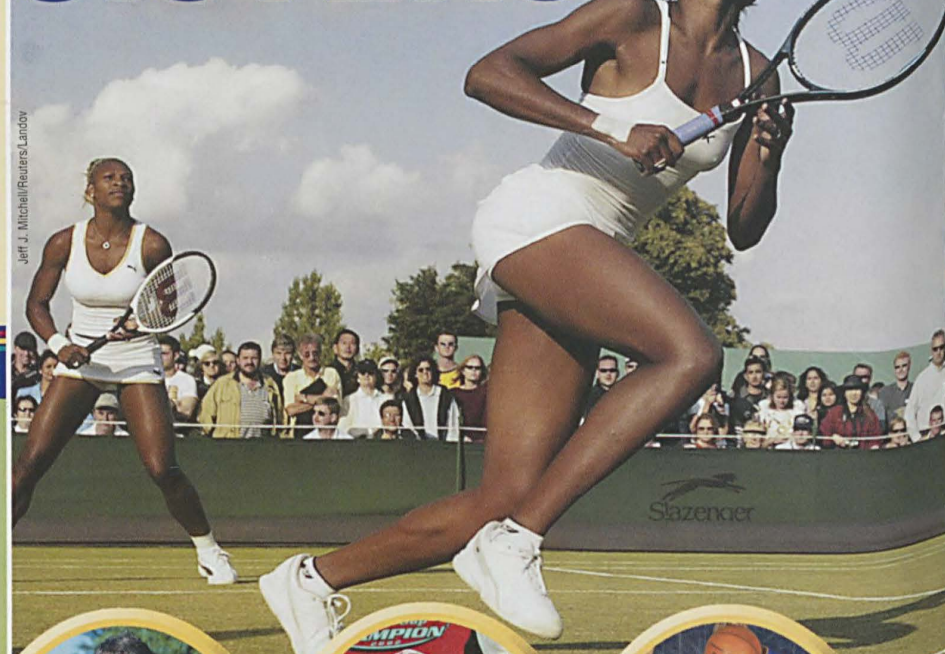

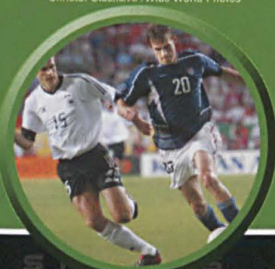

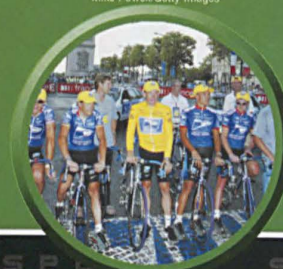

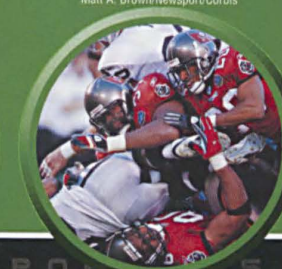
